Call to Order

President Bean noted that there was a quorum present and called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

Board Business

Introductions

Board Members

President Bean welcomed those in attendance to the meeting and introduced herself as President of the Board. She then introduced and welcomed the two (2) newest members of the Board, Dr. Cathy Graves, D.D.S. and Dr. Wayne Wauligman, D.D.S. She asked the rest of the Board members to introduce themselves: Vice President

President Bean noted that the Board's public member, Mr. Trevor Vessels, was not in attendance at the meeting due to a scheduling conflict.

Approval of Agenda

President Bean noted that this was the first meeting of the Board since their last meeting in June due to attendance issues for the scheduled July meeting. She then asked if there was a motion to approve the Board meeting agenda with the caveat to amend the agenda due to any extenuating circumstances.

President Bean stated that the Board was now in recess at 1:56 p.m. for executive session. The Board requested that Director Kamdar, AAG Katherine Bockbrader, Deputy Director Santiago, and Deputy Director Schaal join the executive session. All other guests and staff were requested to leave and take all personal items, including briefcases, purses, cell phones, tablets, etc. with them when they exited the room. President Bean indicated that they would be invited back into the meeting once the executive session was concluded.

The Board resumed the open session at approximately 2:39 p.m.

Enforcement

Report and Recommendations

Daxeshkumar Patel, D.D.S.

President Bean announced that the Board would now consider the Attorney Hearing Examiner's Report and Recommendation in the matter of Daxeshkumar Patel, D.D.S. that was filed by Attorney Hearing Examiner Ronda Shamansky on August 5, 2024.

President Bean asked if each member of the Board had an opportunity to review the Report and Recommendation, transcript, and exhibits in the matter of Daxeshkumar Patel, D.D.S. that were made available prior to the meeting. She stated that she was President of the Board for the record then asked each member of the Board to identify themselves and confirm that they had the opportunity to review all the information prior to the meeting today.

President Bean informed the Board that Dr. Patel, his attorney Mr. Bob Kish, and Assistant Attorney General Katherine Bockbrader had requested to present oral arguments.

President Bean stated that the Board's minutes serve as the official record of the proceedings. She stated that each of them would have seven (7) minutes to address the Board limiting their comments to the evidence that was presented during the hearing. She explained that the Board would only consider evidence that was presented during the administrative hearing in this matter.

Mr. Kish stated that he would not be presenting oral arguments, but Dr. Patel wished to speak to the Board.

President Bean then indicated that Dr. Patel could proceed with oral arguments.

Daxeshkumar Patel, D.D.S.

Dr. Patel introduced himself and thanked the Board members for the opportunity to speak with them. He stated that he did not know at the time on August 10, 2021, that his life was about to change as he was trying to help one of his patients that was suffering. He stated that day was the beginning of a series of events that caused him to appear before the Board. When his patient first presented to him it was clear to Dr. Patel that the patient was suffering with broken teeth. He stated that he was in pain and having difficulty eating; and had poor quality of life in part because of his condition and the state of his mouth. Dr. Patel stated that as a dentist and as a human being he wanted to help as that was one of the reasons he became a dentist. He had concerns that the patient would be unwilling or unable to engage in a long-term extensive treatment plan. He also had to weigh this against all the patients' other medical conditions to make sure the proposed treatment plan could be carried out safely.

Dr. Patel stated that he learned a great deal about his patient's health history and the medications he was taking, which included blood thinners. He recognized the need to obtain medical clearance. And, given that the patient had recently received a complete physical examination from his primary care physician (PCP), Dr. Patel believed that the patient's PCP was in the best position to provide the medical opinion as to whether the patient was medically stable for the extractions and whether any special precautions should be taken. Dr. Patel stated that when he heard that the patient was taken to the hospital for a bleeding episode, he was initially informed that the episode was not related to the dental care he had provided. However, Dr. Patel stated that his first reaction was concern for his patient because a good dentist does not only care about his patient's teeth but also cares about what happens to the patient. He stated that when he heard that the patient had passed away nine (9) days later he was devastated. Dr. Patel commented that the patient was a great person who was loved deeply by his companion. He stated that his death was probably difficult for the companion as he recalled going through a grieving process himself which was amplified by the accusations that he was the cause of the death of his patient. Dr. Patel stated that the allegations reopened the wounds and the investigation that followed caused a tremendous amount of stress, anxiety, and concerns not only for himself, but for the potential impact on others under his care.

Dr. Patel stated that he believed in the care that he provided to the patient even when going through the hearing process, although the Hearing Examiner found otherwise. Dr. Patel said that going through the hearing was important in that he had not known that the patient had an undiagnosed gastrointestinal (GI) bleed that preceded his treatment. He stated that the hospital had indicated the GI bleed was the cause of his patient's death and if one read the cross-examination of Dr. Baur, they would understand why he feels he was not the cause of death for the patient.

Dr. Patel stated that he had read the Hearing Examiner's report, and he understands there is an opportunity to provide even better care to his patients as all good dentists should want to improve. He stated that he has learned through this process over the past couple of years, that he had grown as a dentist, and his patients have been and continue to be better for it. Dr. Patel stated that it was his understanding that the Hearing Examiner was recommending a thirty (30) day suspension or until he completes additional continuing education that the Board determines is warranted. He stated that if the goal of the Board was to protect the public then he was willing to complete any continuing education that the Board believes is necessary as it will only help him to be a better dentist when it comes to treating his patients. However, this incident happened over three (3) years ago and if the Board felt that he was a danger to his patients then they would have taken action a long time ago. He stated that he never had any complaints about him to the Board before this incident and has not had any in the three (3) years since. He stated that he practices in central Ohio where there are insufficient numbers of dentists to help patients and that to suspend him would have a detrimental effect on patients that he will not be able to treat, as well as affecting his seven (7) staff members. He reiterated that if their goal was protecting the public then additional continuing education would accomplish that and he respectfully requests that they not impose a suspension of his license but rather order him to complete necessary continuing education within thirty (30) days. Dr. Patel then thanked the Board for the opportunity to speak.

Katherine Bockbrader, Esq.

Ms. Bockbrader stated there were two (2) main issues in this case: Dr. Patel's medical clearance for the patient to undergo the procedure and the ability to minimize the risk of bleeding. On the medical clearance issue, Dr. Baur, the Board's expert, put it best when he said that you do not want to operate on a stranger as the standard of care requires a dentist to understand the patient's medical status before operating on the patient. This patient had multiple serious medical conditions that made this procedure risky. The patient was on dialysis; had COPD and asthma; was on three (3) medications for blood pressure; had a history of stroke; and he was on two (2) anti-coagulant medications. She stated that with all these conditions the patient is certainly at greater risk than a healthy patient. Even if simple extractions were performed, more information about the patient's current health status should be obtained. Dr. Patel did obtain a medical clearance, but that does not end his responsibility. Dr. Patel did not take into consideration the risks with the number of extractions that were planned. First, Dr. Patel did not ensure that the patient's physician understood the extent of the extractions, the amount of bleeding that was likely to occur given the inflamed tissue, and he did not advise the patient's physician as to the number of extractions planned. More importantly, the dentist has an independent responsibility to understand his patients' condition and to plan his treatment to ensure that it is safe. It is understandable that the patient's physician did not want to take the patient off blood thinners due to his risk of stroke. But once that parameter was set by the physician, then Dr. Patel needed to adjust his treatment plan to account for that factor to minimize the risk for that patient. The risks for the patient were great because of his conditions and the standard of care required Dr. Patel to either stage the extractions to see how much bleeding occurred initially, or to perform them in a hospital.

Ms. Bockbrader stated that Dr. Patel testified that he waited twenty (20) minutes after extracting a couple of teeth. However, Dr. Baur testified that time is not sufficient because the lack of bleeding in the first twenty (20)

minutes does not indicate that the patient is not going to have excessive bleeding later after epinephrine and other medications wear off. In the alternative, the extractions should have been performed in a hospital where additional medications, monitoring, and emergency response would have been available.

Finally, the Hearing Examiner correctly concluded that Dr. Patel did not do enough to prevent excessive bleeding by using material such as gel foam, as well as sutures. Dr. Patel and his expert, Dr. Lewis, agreed that standard of care required him to use gel foam for this particular patient. Dr. Patel claimed that he used gel foam but did not document that information in the patient chart. The Hearing Examiner found that claim substantive. Dr. Patel charted that he used gauze, even charted that he gave the patient extra gauze to take home but he did not chart that he used gel foam. Moreover, when Dr. Patel provided his initial report to the Board and the more detailed adverse occurrence report a few weeks later, he again made no mention of using gel foam. The adverse occurrence report to the Board was Dr. Patel's chance to explain his treatment to the Board to help convince the Board that he had met the standard of care, that he knew the patient had a bleeding episode. If he had used gel foam, he would have wanted the Board to know that and included that in his report. Moreover, even if the gel foam was used, Dr. Baur testified that for this patient the standard of care required sutures because sometimes gel foam can become dislodged particularly when a patient is on multiple blood thinners. Dr. Patel admitted that he did not use sutures in this case and therefore, he did not meet the standard of care.

There was a lot of talk about causation at this hearing and whether Dr. Patel's treatment caused the bleeding or caused the patient's death. It is important to note that the Board is not required to show that Dr. Patel's violation caused the patient's bleeding or caused the patient's death. The Revised Code states that the Board is authorized to discipline a dentist for a violation of the standard of care whether or not injury to patient results. The Hearing Examiner correctly found that there was ample evidence in the records that the patient had extensive bleeding from the extraction sites and while he also may have had a gastrointestinal (GI) bleed, there was certainly much evidence in the records from the hospital and from the patient's family that he had saturated washcloths, his pillow was saturated with blood, the hospital suctioned out 200 ML of blood [from the patient's stomach]. The Hearing Examiner correctly found from the exhibits that the main source of bleeding was from the patient mouth.

The Hearing Examiner agreed that Dr. Patel violated the standard of care and recommended a thirty (30) day suspension and appropriate continuing education to be determined by the Board. The Hearing Examiner noted that Dr. Patel was a relatively new practitioner and that he certainly did not intend to harm the patient. If the Board does see the need to alter the recommended suspension period or the continuing education, you must state the reasoning behind the changes to the recommended order.

Ms. Bockbrader concluded by stating that these sanctions are necessary to protect the public and to ensure that Dr. Patel understands the importance of obtaining complete medical information regarding patients and in taking appropriate steps to protect medically compromised patients.

President Bean thanked Dr. Patel and Ms. Bockbrader for their comments then stated that the Board would consider the disposition of this case in quasi-judicial deliberations following the Evidentiary Hearings.

Personal Appearances

Carl E. Radcliff, Jr., Dental X-ray Machine Operator

Dental Board Enforcement Officer Jerry Zachariah provided a summary of the matter of Carl E. Radcliff, Jr., Dental X-ray Machine Operator for the Board. Mr. Zachariah stated that Mr. Radcliff was issued a Dental X-ray Machine Operators certificate on March 8, 2010. On August 8, 2021, Mr. Radcliff was convicted of a fourth-degree felony,

Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence (OVI) in Ottawa County, Ohio. Mr. Radcliff was sentenced to ninety (90) days in jail, three (3) years of probation, and his driver's license was suspended for fifteen (15) years.

Mr. Zachariah stated that on September 20, 2023, Mr. Radcliff entered into a Consent Agreement with the Board. During the time he has been supervised under the Consent Agreement, Mr. Radcliff has successfully completed no less than three AA or NA meetings per week and received an evaluation from a treating physician which indicates he is no longer drug or alcohol dependent and is able to practice as a radiographer within the accepted standards of the profession. Mr. Radcliff has remained compliant with the terms of his Consent Agreement and is before you today at the Board's request to fully reinstate his radiology certificate. Mr. Radcliff is available for any questions you might have.

Upon questioning by the Board, Mr. Radcliff stated that on the date that he was arrested he entered an Intensive Out-Patient (IOP) program which consisted of counseling once per week, and group sessions three (3) times a week. He stated that he continued this course of treatment for a year and he continues to attend AA meetings. Mr. Radcliff informed the Board members that a few years ago he decided to practice advocacy, and he continues to be active in recovery. He stated that he is a minister who enjoys preaching and teaching the Bible three to four (3-4) times a week. He said that he was before the members at their request to fully reinstate his radiographer's certificate.

When asked about his efforts at recovery, Mr. Radcliffe stated that he has been married eight (8) years, continues to take care of his family responsibly, and has minimized the amount of association he has with anyone who drinks alcohol. He informed the members that he does not allow any alcohol in his house or around himself, and that he does not go to establishments where alcohol is present. Mr. Radcliff said that as for his recovery he has no intentions of returning to that life. He stated that he loves being proactive in what he does and feels that he now has the right tools to abstain from alcohol. He stated that his goal is to return to practicing in the dental field. He was working as a dental assistant but currently he is in an office where he is responsible for ordering supplies, maintenance, and does some training. He said he would like to get his radiography certificate back because he loves working with patients.

President Bean thanked Mr. Radcliff and Mr. Zachariah and indicated the Board would be discussing this request during quasi-judicial deliberations after the two (2) Evidentiary Hearings.

[Evidentiary Hearing in the Matter of George Loewen, D.D.S.](#)

President Bean stated that the Board would now consider an evidentiary review in the matter of George Loewen, D.D.S. in accordance with Chapters 119. and 4715. of the Ohio Revised Code. She stated it was 3:35 p.m. on September 11, 2024, and asked that the record reflect that Dr. Loewen had not requested a hearing pursuant to the Notice of Opportunity for Hearing dated May 8, 2023. President Bean indicated that the proceeding would not consist of a full adversarial and evidentiary proceeding, but a reliable evidentiary review. She stated that while the Respondent may attend the hearing due to its public nature, they cannot testify; call witnesses or present witnesses; and the Respondent has no right to make any argument in the proceeding. She stated that the Board's minutes would serve as the record of the proceeding.

President Bean identified herself as President of the Board for the record and then asked the rest of the Board members to identify themselves for the record:

President Bean asked Assistant Attorney General Katherine Bockbrader if there were any preliminary matters or motions for the Board to consider and if she had prepared an opening statement.

Ms. Bockbrader stated Dr. Loewen applied for licensure with the Board and the Board issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing proposing to deny his application because as indicated in the Notice he has a formal caution action from the Dental Regulatory body in Canada. She stated that the Board has the opportunity to deny his license or to grant a license to practice with whatever restrictions or conditions they wish to impose.

President Bean asked if there was anything Ms. Bockbrader wanted to submit as evidence in this matter.

Ms. Bockbrader stated that the evidence related to the allegations had been provided to the Board members prior to the meeting along with an Affidavit from Enforcement Officer Barbara Yehnert. She asked that the Affidavit and State's Exhibits 1-14 be admitted into evidence.

President Bean admitted the Affidavit of Barbara Yehnert and State's Exhibits 1-14 into evidence. She then asked for the record if each member of the Board had an opportunity to review the Affidavit of Ms. Yehnert and the State's Exhibits in the matter of George Loewen, D.D.S. that were made available to them prior to the meeting?

[Evidentiary Hearing in the Felipe T. Rea, D.D.S.](#)

President Bean stated that the Board would now consider an evidentiary review in the matter of Felipe T. Rea, D.D.S. in accordance with Chapters 119. and 4715. of the Ohio Revised Code. She stated it was 3:39 p.m. on September 11, 2024, and asked that the record reflect that Dr. Rea had not requested a hearing pursuant to the Notice of Opportunity for Hearing dated December 15, 2022. President Bean indicated that the proceeding would

not consist of a full adversarial and evidentiary proceeding, but a reliable evidentiary review. She stated that while the Respondent may attend the hearing due to its public nature, they cannot testify, call witnesses, or present witnesses and the Respondent has no right to make any argument in the proceeding. The purpose of this proceeding is to give the Board information about this matter in lieu of the administrative hearing that would have occurred if Dr. Rea had properly requested a hearing. She stated that the Board's minutes would serve as the record of the proceeding.

President Bean stated that the Board would recess for quasi-judicial deliberations and that only Board members, Director Kamdar, Deputy Director Santiago, and Deputy Director Schaal were invited to remain in the room to assist with deliberation. Members of the public, SIP members who reviewed the investigation of these cases, the AAG who represented the Board in these cases, any Board members who have a conflict of interest in these matters, and other staff will not be in attendance to this discussion. The Board will announce its decision when they return to the public session. The Board will notify Dr. Patel, Dr. Loewen, and Dr. Rea in writing of their decision after today's Board meeting.

Open Session

The Board resumed the open session at approximately 4:27 p.m.

President Bean said that the record should reflect that Dr. Brisley-Sedon and Dr. Bean were Secretaries in these matters, did not participate in deliberations or discussion in these matters. Therefore, they abstained from the final vote.

President Bean then turned the meeting over to Deputy Director Santiago for the Enforcement matters.

In the Matter of Daxeshkumar Patel, D.D.S.

24-09-06 Motion by Dr. Carr, second by Dr. Kelley, that the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law in the Hearing Examiner's Report and Recommendation are found to be true, and it is hereby ORDERED that:

DR. PATEL's license to practice as a dentist in the State of Ohio be suspended for an indefinite period of time but not less than thirty (30) days. Upon reinstatement, Dr. Patel's license shall be subject to the following PROBATIONARY terms, conditions, and limitations for a minimum period of one (1) year.

SUSPENSION

- 1. DR. PATEL's license to practice dentistry shall be suspended for an indefinite period of time but not less than thirty (30) days. It is expressly understood that during this period of suspension the following conditions shall apply:*
 - a. DR. PATEL may not perform dentistry or dental hygiene duties, administer anesthesia/sedation, or otherwise treat patients in any manner during the period of suspension;*
 - b. DR. PATEL shall not derive income from either a legal or beneficial interest in a dental practice, except income for treatment provided prior to the beginning of the suspension;*
 - c. DR. PATEL may not employ any licensed operators, e.g., dentists, dental hygienists, expanded function dental auxiliaries, radiographers, or dental assistants. Independent contractors are deemed to be employees for purposes of this ORDER; and,*
 - d. A receptionist may answer the telephones saying, "Dr. Patel's office" or the name of the practice for the sole purpose of answering questions, scheduling/rescheduling appointments, or making referrals.*
 - e. DR. PATEL shall provide a copy to current employer within three (3) days of the effective date of this ORDER.*

CONDITIONS FOR REINSTATEMENT

- 2. The BOARD shall not consider reinstatement of DR. PATEL's license to practice dentistry until DR. PATEL provides proof that all of the following requirements have been met:*
 - a. DR. PATEL shall successfully complete ten (10) hours of continuing education courses in pharmacology. The education must be taken through a BOARD approved provider and must be approved in advance by the BOARD's Supervisory Investigatory Panel (PANEL). Proof of successful completion of courses required in this paragraph shall be submitted to the PANEL within one hundred eighty (180) days from the effective date of this ORDER. The continuing education hours shall not count towards the continuing education requirements set forth in section 4715.141, ORC.*
 - b. DR. PATEL shall successfully complete ten (10) hours of continuing education courses in surgery on medically compromised patients. The education must be taken through a BOARD approved provider and must be approved in advance by the PANEL. Proof of successful completion of courses required in this paragraph shall be submitted to the PANEL within one hundred eighty (180) days from the effective date of this ORDER. The continuing education hours shall not count towards the continuing education requirements set forth in section 4715.141, ORC.*

- c. DR. PATEL shall successfully complete five (5) hours of continuing education courses in documentation. The education must be taken through a BOARD approved provider and must be approved in advance by the PANEL. Proof of successful completion of courses required in this paragraph shall be submitted to the PANEL within one hundred eighty (180) days from the effective date of this ORDER. The continuing education hours shall not count towards the continuing education requirements set forth in section 4715.141, ORC.
- d. DR. PATEL shall be responsible for the expenses associated with the above conditions for reinstatement.

PROBATION

Upon reinstatement, DR. PATEL's license shall be subject to the following PROBATIONARY terms, conditions, and limitations for a minimum period of one (1) year:

1. DR. PATEL shall fully cooperate with Board investigators in accordance with law;
2. DR. PATEL, upon request by the Board, shall make any or all of his patient records available for inspection and review. At the Board's discretion, such records may be reviewed by a consultant to the Board;
3. DR. PATEL shall disclose a copy of this ORDER to every employer on or before his first date of employment as a dentist or before the first date he returns to practice with his current employer;
4. DR. PATEL shall submit quarterly declarations, to be received by **the fifth day of the applicable month**, under penalty of BOARD disciplinary action stating whether there has been compliance with all the conditions of this ORDER;
5. DR. PATEL may not instruct, teach, or present any continuing education courses or training during the probationary period;
6. DR. PATEL shall obey all federal, state, and local laws, and all rules governing the practice of dentistry in Ohio;
7. DR. PATEL shall be responsible for the expenses associated with the above probation requirements;
8. In the event DR. PATEL is found to have failed to comply with any provision of this ORDER, and is so notified of that deficiency in writing, such periods of noncompliance will not apply to the reduction of the probationary period;
9. In the event that DR. PATEL should leave or reside or practice outside Ohio for three (3) continuous months, DR. PATEL must notify the BOARD in writing of the dates of departure and return. Periods of time spent outside Ohio for three (3) continuous months or more will not apply to the reduction of this period under the ORDER, unless otherwise determined by motion of the BOARD in instances where the BOARD can be assured that probationary monitoring is otherwise being performed;
10. Subject to the provisions of Chapter 119, if, in the discretion of the Board, DR. PATEL appears to have violated or breached any terms or restrictions of this ORDER, the Board reserves the right to institute

formal disciplinary proceedings for any and all possible violations or breaches, including, but not limited to, alleged violations of the laws of Ohio occurring before the effective date of this ORDER;

- 11. DR. PATEL shall appear in person for quarterly interviews, if requested, before the BOARD or its designated representative, or as otherwise directed by the BOARD; and*
- 12. Upon successful completion of his probationary terms, DR. PATEL must appear before the BOARD or its designee before the BOARD will fully restore DR. PATEL's license to practice dentistry.*

DURATION/MODIFICATION OF TERMS

The BOARD may only alter the probationary period imposed by this ORDER if: (1) the Board determines that DR. PATEL has complied with all aspects of this ORDER; and (2) the BOARD determines that DR. PATEL is able to practice dentistry according to accepted standards of the profession without BOARD monitoring, based upon an interview with DR. PATEL by the BOARD or its designee.

The Board hereby certifies that this ORDER shall become effective upon the date of certification of service signed below, and is hereby entered upon the journal of the Board for the 11th day of September, 2024.

Enforcement Update

He stated there were initially ten (10) licensees and certificate holders under current suspension, but the Board members had just reinstated Mr. Radcliff's Dental X-ray Machine Operator Certificate. Deputy Director Santiago informed the members that there were forty-two (42) licensees and certificate holders with older suspensions, and currently the Board has two hundred and fifty-one (251) active cases. He indicated that two (2) cases have been referred to QUIP and currently two (2) more cases pending QUIP. He informed the members that ninety (90) cases have been reviewed by the Board Secretaries and recommending that they be closed at this time with twenty-two (22) warning letters to be issued; and that there are currently forty (40) licensees on probation.

Committee Reports

Education

Dr. Carr, Chair of the Education Committee, stated the Committee had met at 10:13 a.m. that day with members Dr. Williams and Ms. Scaramucci in attendance along with several guests.

Old Business

Jurisprudence Examinations

Dr. Carr stated that under Old Business the Committee had completed their task of updating the dental and dental hygiene jurisprudence examinations. She stated that they have been given to Deputy Director and Chief Legal Counsel Miguel Santiago for review and the plan is to implement both examinations beginning in January 2025.

Dr. Carr informed the Board members that the Committee had also been tasked with looking into potential systems that applicants for licensure could take the jurisprudence exam and these exams would immediately be graded. An adequate system was not found but the Committee was informed that the Department of

Administrative Services (DAS) is upgrading their system for licensing boards in the future and this capability would be part of the upgrade.

New Business

Dental Anesthesia/Sedation Permit Renewal Course

Dr. Carr stated that the Committee had received a request for approval of the course “ADMA 22 Common Sedation Emergencies” provided by the Academy of Dental and Medical Anesthesia. She stated that the course was reviewed by the Board’s expert, Dr. Gregoy Ness who informed the Committee that the course met the requirements for approval. The course curriculum and material were also reviewed by the Committee and was recommended for Board approval.

Expanded Function Dental Auxiliary Discussion

Dr. Carr informed the Board members that three (3) items had been brought to the attention of the Committee for discussion regarding Expanded Function Dental Auxiliaries (EFDAs); Out-of-State Applicants, Graduates of Dental Colleges Located Outside the United States, and Title IV Considerations.

Dr. Carr stated that reciprocity is to be granted to out-of-state EFDA applicants wanting to register in the State of Ohio as a result of the passing of SB 131. However, this is problematic in that the applicants may or may not meet the requirements set forth in the Dental Practice Act and/or the duties and functions of the out-of-state applicants may not be the same as those in Ohio.

Dr. Carr said that it has come to the attention of the Board that international dental graduates may not be taking the required course work prior to sitting for the EFDA examinations which is a requirement for the applicant to receive an EFDA Registration.

Dr. Carr stated that due to changes in Title IV, Federal funding may be cut for programs that require more hours of training than needed. This potentially only applies to EFDA programs. Ohio requires 180 hours of training to apply for an EFDA registration, however the number of hours varies greatly among Ohio EFDA programs.

Topics for Next Meeting

Dr. Carr informed the Board members that for the next meeting the Committee will investigate the number of hours of training in the EFDA programs in Ohio and contact the EFDA organization to get their input on the aforementioned items. The Committee plans to report back to the Board at the October meeting.

Dr. Carr informed the Board that the Committee meeting was adjourned at 10:49 a.m.

President Bean thanked Dr. Carr and stated that after the Education Committee met the Research Committee had met. She then asked Ms. Scaramucci to provide the Research Committee Report.

Research

Ms. Scaramucci, Chair of the Research Committee, stated they had met at 11:18 a.m. that day with Committee members Dr. Brisley-Sedon and Dr. Kirtland in attendance along with several guests. She stated that the Law and Rules Review committee tasked the Research Committee with investigating monetary fines in other states. She said that they had investigated fourteen (14) states with a similar size dental and dental hygiene populations. Ms. Scaramucci noted that the Committee identified two (2) areas of inconsistency in their research: difficulty in reaching other state dental boards due to limited information on contacts or website information and data supplied by the American Dental Association of the number of dentists licensed by state was inaccurate for Ohio, and therefore, it was assumed it was not accurate for any other states.

Ms. Scaramucci informed the members about the findings of the Committee: ten (10) of the fourteen (14) states investigated have fining authority with fines ranging from \$1000 to a maximum of \$250,000, some states have fining authority to include recovery cost to the board, and most fines collected were not placed directly into the individual board's budget. She stated that the most prevalent violations were for failure to renew licenses. She stated two (2) states have developed rubrics to determine the fine amount with some states basing their fines on repeat violations. Ms. Scaramucci noted that typically, the fines were \$1000 per violation.

Ms. Scaramucci said that a discussion ensued regarding how the board could implement the fines, whether fining would be in lieu of consent agreements, or whether fines for violations would be included in consent agreements along with additional terms. She stated that past meetings with stakeholders resulted in a suggested maximum fine of up to \$2000. The result of the discussion is that the Committee will review the two (2) rubrics currently available to discern how the fines may fit into the Boards disciplinary actions. Ms. Scaramucci stated that both rubrics will be shared with the Committee and SIP coordinator.

Ms. Scaramucci informed the Board members that there were no other discussion items and the topic for the next meeting of the Committee will be to assess rubric criteria as it may relate to disciplinary actions for the Board. She stated that the meeting was adjourned at 11:41 am.

Law and Rules Review

President Bean stated the Committee had met earlier that day at 2:15 p.m. with herself as Chair, and Dr. Krob in attendance. Mr. Eric Richmond of the Ohio Dental Association and Ms. Kelsey Woolard representing the Ohio Dental Hygienists' Association were also in attendance.

Old Business

President Bean stated that under Old Business the Committee had received a status update on the rules that were initial filed June 27, 2024. Of the three (3) rules initial filed, two (2) rules were filed with amendments and one (1) of the rules with no changes. The amended rules have completed both of their public rules hearings before the Board and JCARR without opposition. The rules have now been final filed with an effective date of September 18,

2024. The one (1) no change rule remains in JCARR jurisdiction until September 25, 2024. Once JCARR jurisdiction ends, the rule will remain in effect with its current effective date of May 5, 2014.

New Business

Specialty and Advertising Rules

President Bean stated that the first item under New Business was the specialty and advertising rules. Drafts of the proposed specialty and advertising rules were distributed to the Committee members and the Board's Chief Legal Counsel, Deputy Director Santiago provided a summary of the changes that are being recommended. She stated that at this time the Committee decided that we would hold off and get more information, comments, and perspectives from our stakeholders before we move these rules forward to the Board for consideration of a vote.

5-Year Rule Review: 11/25/2024 Review Date

President Bean informed the Board that during their last meeting in June, she had asked the Committee members to perform one final review of the last grouping of six (6) rules for this year that have a 5-Year Review Date of November 25, 2024. She stated that the amended rules were provided to the members and contained the recommended changes to date. Since the Committee had not met in July as originally planned, she asked the Committee members to continue their review of these six (6) rules and to submit any additional comments to Deputy Director Schaal by September 29, 2024 for inclusion in the workbook for the next meeting.

4715-6-03 Prescribing for subacute and chronic pain

President Bean stated that the Committee had the opportunity to review the Board of Pharmacy's rules and additional information provided by Deputy Director Schaal. An amendment to rule 4715-6-03 was drafted and presented to the Committee.

American Medical Technologists (AMT) Registered Dental Assistant (RDA) Examination

President Bean informed the Board members that during the meeting in June, the Committee had decided to review all thirteen (13) rules in Chapter 11 since the Committee would be updating several to include acceptance of the American Medical Technologists Registered Dental Assistant (AMT RDA) examination for dental assistants along with other "clean-up" corrections. A draft workbook was distributed to the Committee members in preparation for the Committee's next meeting.

President Bean stated that due to time constraints the Committee meeting was adjourned at 3:15 p.m.

Executive Updates

President's Update

Welcome New Board Members

President Bean wished to welcome the Board's newest members, Dr. Cathy Graves, D.D.S. and Dr. Wayne Wauligman, D.D.S.. She stated it was her hope that everyone welcomed them and treated them kindly during their first meeting and looks forward to working with them.

Board Member Resignation – Faisal A. Quereshy, D.D.S., M.D.

President Bean stated she wanted to recognize Dr. Faisal A. Quereshy, D.D.S., M.D. who had served the Board since 2018. Due to professional and other personal obligations, he felt the need to resign from the Board. President Bean expressed that the Board was very appreciative of his time, effort, and his service for the Board and stated that it had been a joy to work with him.

She then turned the meeting over to Director Kamdar for the Executive Director's Update.

Executive Director's Update

Budget Request

Director Kamdar welcomed the new Board members and commented that they "hit the ground running" with this Board meeting with the large number of legal documents they were required to review to be prepared for their first meeting. He stated that one might think that the Board had a staff of fifteen (15) in our Legal Department when the reality is that they have one (1), Chief Legal Counsel Miguel Santiago and Ms. Bockbrader who is kind enough to provide her assistance from the Attorney General's Office. Director Kamdar noted that Mr. Santiago has produced a record number of action agreements in the one (1) year he has been with the Board when compared with the total number of actionable documents in the previous three (3) years. Director Kamdar stated that they will be sharing this information with the Office of Budget and Management when they submit a request for another attorney position for the Board.

Ohio Dental Association Annual Session – House of Delegates

Director Kamdar reminded the Board members that President Bean would be delivering her speech the next morning to the Ohio Dental Association House of Delegates.

Interstate Compact Commission

Director Kamdar asked Deputy Director Corey Schaal as the Board's representative on the Interstate Compact Bill to provide the members with an update.

Deputy Director Schaal informed the Board that the Interstate Compact Commission had a meeting via TEAMS wherein he participated along with representatives and commissioners from nine (9) other states. Ten (10) states are currently in the Compact and participated in the meeting, with a number of other people watching online including Dr. Carr and former Board members Ann Naber, RDH and Mark Armstrong, DDS. Many were checking to see whether or not the ten (10) states complied with Council of State Governments (CSG) requirements. He discussed that a lawsuit was filed against the State of Virginia's Board of Dentistry regarding their admission into the compact. Deputy Director Schaal had contacted their Executive Director and received a copy of the lawsuit and passed it on to Deputy Director Santiago to review as they are challenging whether or not this is a violation of the law and rules in Virginia. The law suit alleges that it is an unlawful delegation of authority on the part of the Virginia legislature to enter into the Interstate Compact Commission.

Deputy Director Schaal said that there was talk about funding for the Compact. Funding for the development of the Compact originally came from the U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) and that funding has ended so currently the American Dental Association (ADA) is funding the Compact through the CSG but it will only be funded through December of next year. He stated that CSG will help assist the setup of the Compact through the end of 2025.

Deputy Director Schaal stated that there are plans to hold a hybrid meeting in person and via TEAMS in the first quarter of next year wherein they plan to elect four (4) or five (5) officers. The Commission bylaws are being reviewed and will be voted on in January and their legal counsel provided an update regarding the current bylaws.

There was discussion about a data system in order for the Commission to collect data on those applying for a Compact privilege. The data system will have to have the ability to integrate with local state data systems. Deputy Director Schaal provided cost comparisons ranging from several thousand dollars to \$1,000,000 to acquire and make necessary changes to the already developed nursing compact. He stated that there are currently three (3) other compacts in the process of developing their own data system called Compact Connect which is receiving funding from the U.S. Department of Defense (DoD). The Ohio Counselor, Social Worker, and Marriage and Family Therapist Board (CSWMFT Board) is working on this system for their future compact. Should the Commission choose to partner with Compact Connect they would only have to pay for maintenance and customization and not have to pay for development of a whole data system.

Deputy Director Schaal informed the members that an entity will have to be created to administer the Compact since CSG will not be providing that service in the future. The CSWMFT Board uses a company called CAMS which is a nonprofit affiliate of the Council on Licensure Enforcement and Regulation (CLEAR) which is a national association of occupational regulators. He stated that there was a discussion of funding with no exact amount described. However, most of the other compacts that CSG has set up operate with a budget between \$250K to \$500K per year with funds typically coming from their associations and licensee associations until privileged fees generate sufficient revenue. He stated that there are at least two (2) compacts that assess annual fees on individual states so there may be a fee involved for Ohio to pay perhaps at the beginning of the Compact in order to fund the operation.

Deputy Director Schaal stated that between now and the first meeting of next year, CSG would be sending updates along with nomination forms for the election of officers. They are looking to elect four (4) officers and two (2) other members of the Commission to serve as trustees on the Commission's governing body. He stated that Ohio has the opportunity to nominate an individual to fill one of these roles and that this person need not be a Board member as they can be anyone who has a passion for dentistry.

Director Kamdar then turned the meeting back over to President Bean.

President Bean stated that she hoped the members all had the opportunity to review the suggested dates for Board meetings next year. She stated that she would like to see the meeting schedule finalized by the October meeting.

Director Kamdar suggested that any Board members who had conflicts with the proposed meeting dates should send the information to Ms. Franks and that we will do our best to accommodate most or the majority of the members.

President Bean asked if there were any other items for discussion under Anything for the Good of the Board. She noted that there were none.

Adjourn

President Bean thanked the members for their attendance and reminded them that the next meeting is scheduled on October 2, 2024. She then adjourned the meeting at 5:11 p.m.
