## Key Terms

**Active Member** – An individual receiving benefits

**Adult OWF** – An individual 18 or older receiving Ohio Works First benefits or a minor who is a head of household and receiving Ohio Works First benefits

**Adult SNAP** – An individual over age 22 receiving SNAP benefits

**Child OWF** – An individual under age 18 receiving Ohio Works First benefits

**Child SNAP** – An individual under age 22 who receives SNAP benefits and lives with a parent (natural, adopted or step)

**Children Authorized** – The number of children eligible to receive Publicly Funded Child Care; children can be counted more than once if they are authorized to more than one provider

**Child Care Total Issuance** – The total amount issued for Publicly Funded Child Care, including enhanced Step Up to Quality payments; this number is subject to revision

**Families Authorized** – The number of families authorized to receive Publicly Funded Child Care

**OWF** – Ohio Works First; the financial assistance portion of Ohio's Temporary Assistance to Needy Families program, which provides cash benefits to needy families for up to 36 months

**Publicly Funded Child Care** – Financial assistance to eligible parents to help them with childcare costs while they engage in work, education, or job training

**Recipient** – A person who received a benefit in the reporting month

**SNAP** – Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program; the program formerly known as food stamps, which helps eligible low-income individuals stretch their food budgets and buy healthy food

**SNAP/OWF Individuals in Receipt** – Individuals who received a benefit in the reporting month

**SNAP/OWF Households** – The number of households that received a benefit in the reporting month

**SNAP/OWF Total Issuance** – The total amount issued in benefits in each month, including any recouped overpayments

**Work Eligible Individual** – An individual subject to the Ohio Works First work requirement
