- Progress was made towards a new facility for the State Library's research collection in Columbus.








Ohio Digital Library Circulation by Month





Quick Takeaways:


- Phone Support Calls (655) dominate overall volume.
- ILS work (Circulation + Cataloging 413) represents a major share of operational demand.
- IT Services + ITMaaS (196) and TSC (73) continue to be significant service drivers.

Key service highlights include:

- **SEO ILS staff** held an open office hour introducing the new bounced e-mail handling.
- **Two library visits** – Public Library of Steubenville and Jefferson County, and Upper Sandusky Community Library

For the past 30 days, the Consortium experienced significant activity:

- Over **972,744** items were circulated.
- **197,791** holds were created and **188,394** holds were filled.
- **6,386** new users were created
- **466** interlibrary loan requests were initiated.
- **949** support tickets were created, with **8** relayed to the software vendor.



Now Accepting Applications For The 2026 LSTA Summer Library Program Grant


