
Highlights



Meeting with Senator Kristina Roegner

On November 10 Legislative Liaison Kirstin Krumsee, State Librarian Mandy Knapp, and Director of Library Operations Ryan Burley had the honor of meeting with Senator Kristina Roegner at the Statehouse.

The Senator serves as the Chair of the Senate's General Government Committee and the Vice Chair of the Higher Education and the Ways and Means Committee.

We spoke to her about the State Library of Ohio's positive impact on the State and showed her a variety of rare items from our collection. The Senator, who is currently running for Treasurer of Ohio, was very excited to examine a Treasurer's report from 1827 and other items. She was so excited to see all these materials, including books from the 17th century and letters written by George Washington, that she took several pictures of the documents and books to share with her family and friends.

for the attendees!



Early Literacy 101 covers the Six Early Literacy Skills and Five Early Literacy Practices presented in the PLA/ALSC Every Child Ready to Read® initiative, along with other early literacy concepts, storytime tips, and a brief overview of science of reading.

SEO Service Center—November 2025



The SEO Service Center team answered over 1,393 tickets and customer calls during the month of November.

Key service highlights include:

- Visits to Garnet A. Wilson Public Library of Pike County and Normal Memorial Public Library
- Hosted a Patron Point Info Session for 32 attendees
- Hosted the annual SEO Directors Meeting

For the past 30 days, the Consortium experienced significant activity:

- Over 980,805 items were circulated.
- 5,346 new users were created.
- 179,584 holds were created and 167,545 holds were filled.
- 658 interlibrary loan requests were initiated.
- 806 support tickets were created, with 8 relayed to the software vendor.

November 18, 2025: <u>Former State Librarian Beverly</u> <u>Cain Passes</u>

It is with heavy hearts that we announce that former State Librarian Beverly Cain died on November 18 following a recent medical emergency and subsequent end-of-life care. Beverly is remembered for her unwavering commitment to service, dedication to mentoring library professionals, and passion for the role of libraries in providing access for all. She was an inspirational role model that led with compassion and grace and fostered agency with a steadfast determination that everyone reaches their highest potential.

As State Librarian, Beverly made over 100 visits to libraries throughout Ohio where she met with library managers and staff, toured their facilities, and then wrote summaries of her visits. These summaries were posted with photos on the State Library website and recently compiled in a booklet titled A Collection of State Librarian Beverly Cain's Visits to Ohio Libraries available to read as an online magazine and as a PDF.



Heterick Memorial Library



Our spotlight videos this week feature an academic library and a public library that received federal funding from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) through Ohio LSTA Grants awarded by the State Library of Ohio.

In 2024, the Ohio Northern University <u>Heterick</u> <u>Memorial Library</u> was awarded \$14,250 in federal IMLS funds through an Ohio LSTA Competitive Grant in the Literacy category.

The State Library of Ohio has awarded federal funds from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) as Guiding Ohio Online (GOO) Grants to Way Public Library. Thbe library utilizes these federal dollars, along with their local matching funds, to hire a technology trainer.
